You know that moment when the lights in the concert hall dim and all you see on stage is a chair and a footstool. The audience goes quiet in anticipation of the artist walking on stage. Then, the door opens and the artist enters with a guitar in hand. There is electricity in the air and you are about to enjoy an evening filled with beautiful music. This is a **Season of Celebrations** from the very first concert to the last!

We open the season with a free donor concert on September 30, celebrating the marvelous winner of the Baltimore International Guitar Competition, Andrzej Grygier. On October 21, the Beijing Guitar Duo will celebrate their new CD released that night, and on December 3, we celebrate the holidays in a concert featuring Maryland ensembles, such as the Barrueco Studio Ensemble, the Guitars for Change Ensemble, the Guitar Orchestra, and the Guitar Performance Academy Ensemble.

On February 24, **Sharon Isbin** will celebrate Leo Brouwer's 85th birthday, and on March 30 we will celebrate two young performers who will make their much-anticipated Baltimore debuts: **Petra Poláčková** (Czech Republic) and **Lovro Peretić** (Croatia). In the final concert of the season on April 21, we will celebrate **Manuel Barrueco's** "50 Years on Stage!"

We will present several **master classes**; the **orchestra** will perform at Charlestown; our **artist-in-residence Andrés Felipe Palacios** will visit elementary and middle schools and perform with Columbia Pro Cantare; we present five **Open Stage; commission** works for the **Made in Baltimore** program; in addition to our work with **Guitars for Change**, **Guitars for Veterans**, and the **Lullaby Project**.

1ST PRIZE WINNER Baltimore International Guitar Competition

ANDRZEJ GRYGIER, born in Poland in 1998, began playing the guitar at the age of seven. A student of Lukasz Kropaczewski in the Music Academy in Poznan, Poland, and Paolo Pegoraro in the Segovia Guitar Academy in Pordenone, Italy, Andrzej has been awarded several scholarships for outstanding artistic achievement, among them the "Ministry of Culture and National Heritage Scholarship" and the "Young Poland" scholarship. He has performed as a soloist with several orchestras and given solo recitals in Poland, Germany, Russia, Slovakia, France, Belgium, Italy, and Croatia.

Andrzej had already won over twenty guitar competitions in Italy, Czech Republic, Poland, Germany, Estonia, Austria, and Hungary, before taking part in the Baltimore International Guitar Competition in September of 2022, where he received 1st Prize and the Career Award.

CD RELEASE Celebration

Saturday, October 21, 2023 at 8:00 PM Kaplan Concert Hall, Towson University

BEIJING GUITAR DUO'S "interpretative skills and cross-cultural flair" and their "passionate sensitivity that seems to animate the space between the notes" as *Baltimore Magazine* describes them, has impressed the public since their New York debut at Carnegie Hall.

Also praised by *Classical Guitar Magazine* as "having the star potential to serve as inspiration for new generations of guitarists to come," the Beijing Guitar Duo, comprised of Meng Su and Yameng Wang, has performed around the world in the most prestigious venues such as the Concertgebouw in Amsterdam, Palau de Música in Barcelona, Tchaikovsky Hall in Moscow, and the National Theatre in Beijing, to name only a few. In the 2023-2024 season alone, they will perform in New York, Philadelphia, Dallas, Fort Worth, St. Louis, Akron, and Austin, in addition to their concert and residency in Baltimore.

Their debut CD *Maracaípe*, received a Latin-GRAMMY nomination for the titled piece dedicated to them by Sérgio Assad. Their *Bach to Tan Dun* recording was highly praised for the world-premiere recording of Tan Dun's *Eight Memories in Watercolor* and their recording in trio, *China West*, with Maestro Barrueco includes the *China West Suite* by renown composer Chen Yi arranged for guitar trio. The concert in Baltimore celebrates the release of their third duo recording with music by French composers Fauré, Ravel, Frank, Couperin, and Debussy.



CARNEGIE HALL Weill Music Institute

The Lullaby Project is a program of Carnegie Hall's Weil Music Institute.

Lullaby Project

Many people struggle in our community, especially teen mothers dealing with immigration or refugee status, homelessness, abuse, drug-addition or other issues. The Lullaby Project seeks to bring social change to underserved communities through the guitar.

In our first Lullaby Project, we paired Hispanic, teenmoms with professional songwriters and together they wrote personal lullabies for their babies in an effort to strengthen the bond between the mom and her child. Last season, we implemented three Lullaby Projects: for teen-moms, for immigrant and refugee mothers, and for low-income seniors who wrote lullabies for their grandchildren and great grandchildren for future generations in their families to enjoy.

The programs were implemented in collaboration with Annapolis High School, Teen Parenting Program of Annapolis Family Support Center, Center for Family Support in Essex, the Iris Music Project, and Weinberg Villages Low Income Senior Housing in Owings Mills.

This season we plan to offer the Lullaby Project to veterans and to other underserved communities in our area.

The **Guitars for Change Ensemble**, which features advanced performers from our after-school program in Annapolis, is conducted by Gabriel Rodríguez; our **BCGS Guitar Orchestra**, made up of music lovers in our community, will also perform under the baton of Gabriel Rodríguez; the **Guitar Performance Academy Ensemble** from the Peabody Preparatory is directed by Zoë Johnston Stewart; and the **Barrueco Studio Ensemble**, directed by Manuel Barrueco, will perform a selection from the *Nutcracker Suite* by Tchaikovsky arranged by Andrew York.

Brouwer's 85th Birthday

Acclaimed as "the pre-eminent guitarist of our time," multiple Grammy winner **SHARON ISBIN** was named Musical America's Instrumentalist of the Year, the first guitarist in their 59-year award history.

Sharon has been soloist with over 200 orchestras and has performed in the world's finest halls. Winner of the Munich ARD, Madrid and Toronto Competitions, Germany's Echo Klassik, and *Guitar Player*'s Best Classical Guitarist awards, she performed in Scorsese's Oscar-winning The Departed, the White House by invitation of President Obama, and as the only classical artist in the 2010 Grammy Awards.

The documentary Sharon Isbin: Troubadour, seen by millions on PBS and abroad, won the ASCAP Television Broadcast Award. Latest in her discography of over 35 recordings are her 2020 releases, Affinity and Strings for Peace with Amjad Ali Khan. Her Grammy-winning Journey to the New World with guest Joan Baez spent 63 weeks on top Billboard charts, and her Latin Grammy-nominated disc with the New York Philharmonic is their only recording with guitar.

Recent highlights include collaborations with Sting and sold-out performances at the Kennedy Center and Carnegie Hall. She has premiered over 80 works written for her by some of the world's finest composers, and is the founding director of guitar departments at The Juilliard School and the Aspen Music Festival.

The American Federation of Musicians calls **PETRA POLÁČKOVÁ** "a guitarist of extraordinary ability." Petra began her guitar studies at the age of six and obtained her Bachelor and Master degrees with Paolo Pegoraro from the Universität für Musik und Darstellende Kunst Graz in Austria.

As a result of her numerous first-prize awards, she has been invited to perform by many festivals around the United States, Europe, and Mexico. In 2020, she released her debut CD "*Weiss*" with music by the German lutenist Sylvius Leopold Weiss recorded on a 9-string romantic guitar.

Petra teaches in Austria at the Franz Schubert Music School Fürstenfeld, at Johann-Joseph-Fux Konservatorium in Graz, and was recently appointed Honorary Professor at the Royal Academy of Music Aarhus/Aalborg in Denmark.

In Baltimore, Petra will perform on a 9-string romantic guitar made by Jan Tuláček.



DEBUTS

LOVRO PERETIĆ is an award-winning guitarist from Zagreb, Croatia, who has received top prizes in various guitar competitions. The most significant ones are Guitar Foundation of America and Eurostrings, in addition to competitions in Germany, Italy, Greece, Croatia, France, Belgium, and China.

As a winner of Eurostrings he gave numerous concerts throughout Europe and as a winner of the GFA he recorded his debut album with Naxos to be released this season and he will perform extensively in the United States and Canada.

In addition to solo recitals, Lovro has performed with the Croatian Radio Television Symphony Orchestra, Dubrovnik Symphony Orchestra, and Zagreb Soloists, and he has performed with various chamber music groups such as the guitar trio Evocación, with whom he recently released his first album. Lovro began studying guitar at a young age with Xhevdet Sahatxhija in Zagreb. After graduating, he went on to study with Judicaël Perroy at the Haute Ecole de Musique Genève in Switzerland.



Made in Baltimore COMMISSIONING PROGRAM

The Made in Baltimore commissioning program identifies young composers and commissions them to write new works for the classical guitar. For this year's award, we ask the composers to seek inspiration in the rich history of Baltimore and our state of Maryland.

The program was launched in 2006 by artistic director Manuel Barrueco, and to date 15 new pieces have been created for the classical guitar. One of them, *Inca Dances* by Gabriela Lena Frank, received a Latin Grammy as "Best Contemporary Classical Music Composition."

The Made in Baltimore award ceremony, where the young composers will be officially announced, will take place at the closing concert of the season in April 2024.

Legendary guitarist **MANUEL BARRUECO** is internationally recognized as one of the most important guitarists of our time. His unique artistry is described as that of a superb instrumentalist and a superior and elegant musician, possessing a seductive sound and uncommon lyrical gifts. His career has been dedicated to bringing the guitar to the main musical centers of the world and his commitment to the expansion of the guitar repertoire has led him to collaborations with many distinguished composers.

Barrueco has appeared on a wide array of television programs. He was featured in a Lexus car commercial, his work inspired the biographical documentary *Manuel Barrueco: A Gift and a Life*, and twice he has been the musical guest on PBS' Great Performances: "Now Hear This."

Manuel Barrueco has received several Grammy and Latin Grammy nominations for his recordings on Tonar Music, including his latest release called Music from Cuba and Spain.

Manuel Barrueco immigrated with his family to the United States in 1967 as a political refugee. He completed his advanced studies at the Peabody Conservatory where he now shares his love for music with a small number of exceptionally gifted young guitarists from all over the world.

Manuel Barrueco is the recipient of the United States Artist Fontanals Fellowship for Artistic Excellence.


